FANCY A CHANGE?

A possible new look to our next exhibition/sale 15-16 May Please read the ideas below and send your comments to Frances Evershed by the 29th February and we'll decide at our next committee meeting in March whether to give it a try or stick to the usual format.

Instead of submitting your usual form and entry fee you would apply to hire one side of a screen or if a 3D exhibitor a table for a fee of, say, £25 (price to be confirmed). A screen is approximately 1.8m high x 1.2m wide (6 x 4 feet), so you could hang as many pictures as you wish to fill your space. They can have been previously exhibited. You will be responsible for hanging your pictures and dismantling at the end. You will need to number each exhibit and produce two numbered lists of exhibits stating title, medium and price. One is to be displayed on the screen/table while the other is handed in and kept as a sales record.

There will not be a catalogue of exhibits but one giving a brief description of each exhibitor. Screens and tables will be labelled A, B, C etc and there will be a draw to allocate the screens or tables. Half screens/tables will be available. The screens will be set up on the Thursday evening with exhibitors hanging their work between 9.00 -11.00am. on Friday 15. If you wish to exhibit folios you will need to supply your own stand which will be placed in front of your screen. Two lists for folios will also be needed. Cards will not change. The sales desk will be manned as usual and will deal with all sales. Sales must not be done through the individual artist. A commission will be charged as usual.


