## Show 'n' Tell

Tracy Dudley tells us what happened when fellow BAS members shared their work with (about) twelve of their peers?



About a dozen of us met downstairs at the Courthouse to take part in this year's Critique Evening. Originally, this type of session was run with an external artist coming in to give us each constructive feedback on one or two of our works, but recently we've been doing it amongst ourselves, as between us we have quite a lot of experience to call on. This has always been a positive and friendly session, but this year we decided to ditch the "Critique" title and call it a "Show and Tell" to encourage more people to take part.



At James' invitation, I kicked off the evening and talked through a couple of series of monoprints I'd produced at a workshop the previous weekend at Niki Bell's studio in Chesham, run by Susan Erskine-Jones. Using leaves, textured fabrics and "found objects", we experimented with different inking techniques and "ghost prints". I enjoyed it so much I bought my own portable printing press that evening! It was a really good day and I'd encourage people to have a go if they get a chance to join another of Susan's workshops...

Next, Peter showed us some bold and dramatic drawings he'd produced the previous evening at one of Cheryl Gould's Zoom Life Drawing sessions. He & Jackie have both continued to take part in these weekly sessions since BAS set a couple of sessions up free to BAS members, during the Covid lockdowns. This week's model had been a chap with amazing long, wavy ginger locks and Peter's as-ever dramatic drawings showed them off well!

Jackie had brought some drawings from Cheryl's session, too, and then she talked about her sketchbooks, which she uses a lot when travelling and when she's out and about. She showed us several lovely paintings she'd produced at this year's BAS Summer drawing evenings, including this one of a lock gate, painted near The Rising Sun pub on the canal in Berkhamsted.



Mary showed us some impressive watercolours she'd produced at a BAS Hastoe life drawing morning. These sessions allow longer poses than the Monday evening ones.



Sue Forster also showed us some life drawings; like Peter & Jackie, Sue has continued to take part in the Monday evening Zoom sessions as she likes being able to work at home where she has access to all her materials.

### Show 'n' Tell

Christine

showed us her portrait
of another of our members,
Bert Mabane, produced as a
commission. Difficult to see from a
distance, this drawing had been created
using areas of varying patterns in black pen.
At close quarters, the intricate patterns were
visible and Christine asked for our opinions
on whether and how she should tone
down a particularly dark area that
concerned her. Several suggestions
were made, which Christine
thought she'd try.

New member, Elisabeth, asked for advice on how to finish her beautiful moon and seascape, produced in oils; the general opinion was that it was perfect as it was!



David Satchell rounded off the evening by first showing us 3 photographic studies of a tree, taken in

different seasons, which he'd mounted together in a single frame. Next, a watercolour study of a tree, explaining how he pays attention to the foliage shapes rather than concentrating on the branches. He then brought out this huge, impressive, detailed painting he'd made of part of a trail he used to run through, locally; a view he loved, but which no longer exists. It's good that he has this excellent recreation to look at!



Our Chairman, James, had brought along two paintings he'd produced last year on holiday in St Lucia with his wife, Janet. While Janet was keen to see the various hummingbirds present on the island, James took advantage of a one-hour art class



run by local artist, Naja Misaki Simeon, at Nick Troubetzkoy's Anse Chastenet W W W. ansechastanet.com and painted this landscape. Using simple black outlines in flowing, interconnecting shapes and filling the spaces with vibrant colours, he produced a piece reminiscent of stained glass windows.

All in all, we had a very enjoyable evening, but finished before the end of our available time and would encourage even more members to take part next year!


## Winter Exhibition and Sale
