ways to paint trees

Trees in the Landscape by Keith Fenwick

For years you have successfully painted trees in watercolour - then suddenly you can't. It's all gone! Like writer's block it can be frustrating. Those green and brown blotches don't say anything. They certainly do not say 'Look at me I'm a tree'.

Or maybe you have not been able to paint trees particularly well. Like most creative or sport activities - if its not working, go back to basics. This is what Keith Fenwick does.

Gently he leads you through the various techniques from painting simple sketches of trees in a landscape to more detailed representations to make each tree or group of trees recognizable.

He does indeed show you ten different ways to paint trees such as using the side of a flat brush for foliage and the thumbnail to produce highlights in tree trunks and branches. Of special interest is the way he achieves different tones of paint to produce light and shade.

This video covers studio work using sketches and photographs. And the whole thing comes together when he demonstrates painting outdoors in the Lake District. This is a joy to watch.

A number of videos borrowed by members some time ago have yet to be returned. It is only fair that our video collection be kept in constant circulation so that all members get a chance to see them.
